Registration Instructions

1. Apply to the college that you're interested in attending for dual enrollment

- a) Apply as a dual enrollment student
- b) We do not have application fee waivers for dual enrollment
- c) Most students apply to GA State or Georgia Piedmont Technical College
- 2.Complete the following on <u>GAFutures.org</u>:
 - a) Dual Enrollment Funding Application
 - b) Online Parent Acknowledgement

3. Email Mr. Walker so he can approve the funding for the classes that you chose.

- a) You cannot register for classes until he approves your funding
- b) He will also show you how to register for your classes (GPTC students only)

Scheduling

Students are not allowed to leave school for DE, and then come back to NHS for classes
 We will rearrange the schedule for the student to take college classes at the end of the day
 You must have a total of 7 classes

• i.e. NHS + DE Fall + DE Spring = 7 classes

Transportation

Students are <u>not</u> allowed to be on campus when you're schedule for a college class.
 You have to leave NHS whether those college classes are in-person or online

Funding

You only get 30 credit hrs of funding so that's about 10 college classes

Withdrawing From A College Class

- You must have a total of 7 classes. If you Withdraw from a class, you will have an additional NHS class added to your schedule
- If you Withdraw from a course you cannot receive funding to take that course again (for free)
- A student is no longer eligible to receive program funding after withdrawing from Dual Enrollment courses two times.
- Withdrawal = W (i.e. no impact to your HS or college GPA) Withdrawal Failure = WF (i.e. this counts as an F for HS and college)
- Regardless of whether or not the W/WF is calculated into the high school GPA, it does count toward the student's Satisfactory Academic Progress percentage (needs to 67% completion rate). This can impact their ability to access financial aid post high school graduation.
- Please speak with a college academic advisor and financial aid advisor prior to withdrawing.
